

ProclamationBy the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Medical Advocacy & Outreach (MAO) is a private, non-profit, Rural Health and Wellness Organization, and a community-based AIDS service organization that was established in 1987, by a group of concerned and dedicated Alabama residents; and

WHEREAS, this year marks the 31st anniversary of MAO's mission to educate the public about the HIV/AIDS pandemic, related and similar illnesses, and prevention through culturally competent education, the delivery of medical and behavioral healthcare and social services to those living with HIV/AIDS related, and similar illnesses; and

WHEREAS, MAO has been at the forefront of the AIDS revolution and advancements in rural specialty care with a successful service delivery model that addresses HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis C, diabetes, medical and behavioral health for more than 1,800 individuals spanning 28 South Alabama counties, and empowers an additional 4,500 annually through free testing and education; and

WHEREAS, on September 15, 2018, MAO will host the 5th annual Tread Red Walk & Fun Run in the streets of Montgomery, the Capital City of Alabama, to bring awareness to how critical services are for those living with potentially life-threatening illnesses, and how illnesses such as HIV/AIDS, Hepatitis C, and diabetes continue to impact the lives of everyone, regardless of age, gender, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity or belief; and

WHEREAS, the vision of MAO continues to be that ALL HIV/AIDS will be eradicated. Until that is accomplished, MAO will ensure that all people in its service area living with HIV/AIDS, related, and/or similar illnesses can live a healthy life filled with dignity and respect;
