WHEREAS, assistance is needed to help these people to develop to their fullest potential; and

WHEREAS, advocacy associations have been established at local, state and national levels that provide guidance on education and training, health, recreational, legal and employment issues; and

WHEREAS, the Knights of Columbus, a Catholic, fraternal organization, has adopted people with intellectual disabilities as a special project for concern and assistance; and

WHEREAS, through their annual campaign, Knights of Columbus Councils in Alabama solicit donations by conducting various fund-raising activities during the month of October; and

WHEREAS, during the last 40 years the Knights of Columbus have collected almost \$5.4 million to assist Alabama citizens with intellectual disabilities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim October 2018, as

in the State of Alabama, and, in commemoration of this humanitarian project, urge all citizens to support this special event.
