

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, pediatric brain cancer affects more than 28,000 children every year and is the leading cause of cancer-related death among children and adolescents. Children who have been diagnosed with pediatric brain cancer require more difficult and unique treatments as compared to their adult counterparts; and

WHEREAS, there are few challenges as daunting for families than facing the overwhelming costs associated with their child's medical treatment. In addition to the actual treatment for the patients, families also deal with the emotional and financial burdens associated with the process. Many families find it difficult to juggle the needs of their children with the responsibilities that come from everyday life; and

WHEREAS, Druids Charity Club is a non-profit group consisting of proud Alabamians who have given grants to Alabama families that have been impacted by pediatric brain cancer. These grants have gone towards assisting families with travel, lodging, household expenses, and mortgage payments. This helps provide peace of mind to families so that their priority remains on being a source of comfort and strength for their children; and

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama is home to many nationally recognized BBQ establishments that offer diverse styles and the citizens consider it a source of great pride.
