By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Patricia Barnes a.k.a. Sister Schubert, grew up in Troy, Alabama, learning the technique for baking a perfect dinner roll from her grandmother; and

WHEREAS, Sister Schubert's story began in 1989, when Patricia baked 20 pans of her grandmother's dinner rolls for her church's holiday frozen food fair, quickly selling out; and

WHEREAS, in 1992, Sister Schubert's Homemade Rolls, Inc. began and by 1998 was rolling out over 1 million dinner rolls per day; and

WHEREAS, after the closure of one of their ovens for needed repairs, during the holidays, the employees came together to perform "Share the Warmth"-making blankets for nursing homes, displaced children and rescue animals, assembled bikes for children, collected food for local food pantries and much more; and

WHEREAS, Sister Schubert's Homemade Rolls, Inc., located in Crenshaw County, currently employs 258 people and continues to exemplify the mission of family, philanthropy, and well-made dinner rolls;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim August 26, 2019, as
