By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, National Crime Victims' Rights Week is a special time to join together as Alabamians to Seek Justice, Ensure Victims' Rights and Inspire Hope for the victims of crime; and

WHEREAS, Alabamians are the victims of thousands of crimes each year, affecting victims, their facilities and our communities; and

WHEREAS, it is essential to help victims in Alabama access the justice, assistance, and the support that they need to rebuild their lives; and

WHEREAS, supporting victims of crime is crucial in Alabama as it honors their experiences empowering them to find freedom and strength to overcome their victimization; and

WHEREAS, it is important for us to advocate for victims of crime provide resources for victims of crime and support them in their journey for justice; and

WHEREAS, in Alabama we are determined to respond to crime and violence by helping victims find not only support, recovery, and justice, but also a sense of hope for their future; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Crime Victims' Rights Act provides victims the ability to make informed decisions and meaningfully participate throughout the criminal justice process; and


