By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, gastroparesis is a chronic illness which, according to National Institutes of Health (NIH) estimates, affects more than 5 million people in the United States, yet is little known or understood; and

WHEREAS, gastroparesis is paralysis of the stomach which is characterized by sometimes debilitating pain, nausea, vomiting, and early satiety, and can lead to serious complications such as malnourishment, dehydration, extreme weight fluctuations, esophageal damage, and dangerously erratic blood sugar levels; and

WHEREAS, there is little awareness, no known cure, and few consistently safe, reliable, and effective medications or treatments; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative we seek further research, improved medications, additional treatment options, better support, and hope for our future;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim August 2020, as
