## By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI) is a genetic disorder characterized by fragile bones that break easily; and

WHEREAS, also known as "brittle bone disease," this condition affects individuals throughout his or her entire lifetime; and

WHEREAS, there are different types of OI with a range of severity from mild to life threatening; and

WHEREAS, because there is no cure for OI, treatment focuses on minimizing fractures, the surgical correction of deformity, reducing bone fragility, maximizing mobility and independent function; and

WHEREAS, increased funding for education and research are needed to help find more effective treatments; and

WHEREAS, the Osteogenesis Imperfecta Foundation is declaring May 1-8, 2021 to be National OI Awareness Week and board members, staff, medical professionals and volunteers are joining together to focus attention on OI in an effort to increase awareness;
