

## Proclamation

## By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the state of Alabama is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting our state; and

WHEREAS, a sufficient blood supply is a public safety issue both locally and nationally, and our hospitals and medical centers need a readily available supply for our residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, one blood donation can help up to three patients, and although most of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, only about 3 actually do; and

WHEREAS, Alabama is home to a number of committed public service and private organizations working to raise awareness about the importance of blood donation, including the Vitalant, American Red Cross, the Dr. Daliah Show, and many more; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Blood Donation Day effectively serves to remind us that we need to constantly replenish our blood supply through donation and community awareness;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim September 4th, as
