By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Amyloidosis is a rare disease of which there are several types, one of which is similar to a blood cancer and another that is commonly inherited; and

WHEREAS, the combination of all types of Amyloidosis affect thousands of people in the United States, some of whom live in Alabama; and

WHEREAS, the medial length of survival for an Amyloidosis patient, who does not receive treatment, is less than three years; and

WHEREAS, many patients go undiagnosed every year, and special initiatives, such as this proclamation, can raise public awareness and save lives; and

WHEREAS, the early diagnosis of Amyloidosis in conjunction with prompt treatments not only improves the quality of life, but extends life expectancy; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim March 2022, as
