By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, October 10, 2022, is the 22<sup>nd</sup> anniversary of American Indian Heritage Day in the state of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, many Alabamians are of American Indian heritage and have contributed immeasurably to the state's unique diversity through their culture and traditions; and

WHEREAS, Alabama is the home of nine recognized Tribal Governments that are commended for their leadership in economically supporting state tourism, historical preservation and education through Pow Wows, festivals, motorcycle rides and Indian education programs; and

WHEREAS, Alabama wishes to honor Alabama's indigenous people, their contributions to their homeland and for their passion in keeping American Indian culture and history a vibrant part of Alabama's life;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim October 10, 2022, as
