

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the white cane provides the blind and visually impaired with a means of mobility that increases self-reliance and independence, allowing them to pursue more productive lives; and

WHEREAS, people with disabilities are a part of the community and should have privileges of safe and functional use of the streets, highways, sidewalks, walkways, public buildings and facilities; places of leisure and amusement, as well as other public places to which the public is invited; and

WHEREAS, Alabama law also includes those who use dog guides, giving all the privilege of safe and functional use of public facilities and other places to which the public is invited; and

WHEREAS, a joint resolution of the U.S. Congress established October 15th each year as White Cane Safety Day to provide education and public awareness of the importance of the white cane and the White Cane Law;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim October 15, 2022, as

White Cane Day

in the state of Alabama.
