

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, it is with sincere appreciation that Betty Bell, a champion for children, is remembered for her dedication and hope provided to the people of Alabama, especially many of our youngest citizens; and

WHEREAS, the future pioneer for early intervention in Alabama, Ms. Bell moved to Birmingham in 1970 to lead the infant and toddler center at the University of Alabama at Birmingham's (UAB)'s center for developmental learning disorders; and

WHEREAS, after the grant for the infant and toddler center was exhausted in 1983, Ms. Bell, in partnership with volunteers from the Service Guild of Birmingham, established a new program in a small Sunday school room at Trinity United Methodist Church in Homewood, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, in 1994, due to the program's growth, it moved into its own facility and was later named in Ms. Bell's honor in 2002; and

WHEREAS, under Ms. Bell's leadership, The Bell Center has made immeasurable impacts in the lives of hundreds of children and families, who often arrive in state of fear, but leave knowing their child is going to thrive: and

WHEREAS, Ms. Bell remained active at The Bell Center and continued to change lives for the better. After all, the children The Bell Center served were her life; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Bell's work continues to be replicated around the nation in other early intervention programs, and there is no doubt the lives of children with special needs and their families have been forever changed through the love, commitment and legacy of Ms. Bell; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Bell's legacy will stand the test of time, always to be recognized by those who had the privilege of knowing and learning from her, The Bell Center and the entire state of Alabama;
