## By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, Alabamians have suffered significant effects from severe weather during the primary and secondary severe weather seasons because of storms, tornadoes, straight-line winds and flooding; and

WHEREAS, according to the national weather service, in years past, Alabama has ranked number one in the nation in average annual tornado fatalities, and that number still remains high today; and

WHEREAS, increased public awareness and education regarding severe weather preparedness can substantially decrease the number of lives lost from deadly storms, which can occur any time of the year; and

WIEREAS, our citizens are our state's greatest resource, and historical data shows that building codes, insurance and available emergency funds protect our people, build more resilient communities and position Alabamians to prepare, mitigate, respond and recover more favorably when


