

Proclamation

By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, March is National Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month to raise awareness about the inclusion of people with developmental disabilities (DD) in community life, as well as awareness of the barriers in connecting to the communities in which they live; and

WHEREAS, developmental and intellectual disabilities affect millions nationwide, and individuals with developmental and intellectual disabilities continue to encounter stigma and discrimination due to misinformation and prejudice; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that approximately 2.5% to 3% or approximately 120,000 Alabamians are born with a developmental disability, which creates substantial barriers in participating in the community and exhibiting their full potential, despite individuals with developmental disabilities having the capacity to contribute to society in valuable ways; and

WHEREAS, the Alabama Department of Mental Health (ADMH) and the Alabama Council on Developmental Disabilities are dedicated to working with allies, service providers and partners who recognize the value of every person with a disability. Alabama residents who experience developmental or intellectual disabilities add quality to our communities and the state; and


WHEREAS, the ADMH and partners assist all individuals to live the lives they choose across all life domains: health care, employment, education, recreation and relationships. The ADMH addresses the continuing education of communities, policymakers, healthcare providers and the public toward full and positive inclusion in community life for persons with disabilities; and
