By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, assisted living is an important long-term care option for older adults and individuals with disabilities that fosters choice, dignity and independence; and

WHEREAS, National Assisted Living Week was established in 1995 by the National Center for Assisted Living and is sponsored locally by the Alabama Nursing Home Association to honor the contributions of assisted living communities in providing long-term care to senior citizens and individuals with disabilities; and
