## By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, the tragic events of January 1, 2025, have affected our great nation and have had a direct impact on many people here in Alabama; and

WHEREAS, like every American, I mourn the lives lost in these horrific events and offer my heartfelt prayers to their families, as well as all those injured and affected by this terrorist attack; and

WHEREAS, Kareem Badawi, a freshman at The University of Alabama and Baton Rouge, Louisiana native, lost his life far too soon at the hands of evil. We remember him as one of our own in Alabama; and

WHEREAS, Drew Dauphin, an auto engineer and a 2023 graduate of Auburn University, also tragically lost his life far too soon in this terrorist attack. We, too, remember this Alabamian; and

WHEREAS, in Alabama, we support one another, remain strong in the wake of tragedy and unite during times of need; and

WHEREAS, Alabama stands with the state of Louisiana and the city of New Orleans. Louisiana Governor Jeff Landry has called on his state to observe a period of mourning for each of the victims who lost their lives in the tragic events of January 1; and

WHEREAS, I am joining Governor Landry and the state of Louisiana in a time of recognition and mourning. We will remember those lives lost, especially those who called Alabama home. Flags across the state should remain lowered as a visible sign of respect and remembrance for Kareem Badawi, Drew Dauphin and all victims of the January 1 terrorist attack;
