By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, research has demonstrated women face unique circumstances some of which are longer life expectancy and statistically lower wages when endeavoring to achieve their financial security; and

WHEREAS, many women are likely to become the financial head of household at some point in their lives; and

WHEREAS, financial education is an essential component to financial stability, asset accumulation, and financial freedom; and

WHEREAS, providing tailored professional education and curriculum will promote the development of effective financial habits; and

WHEREAS, resources to identify, avoid, and report suspected financial fraud or inappropriate business practices will be provided to women in Alabama as a tool for their financial gain; and
