WHEREAS, the Freedom Riders were mistreated, beaten and threatened but refused to give up their mission and dream; and

WHEREAS, that courage and hope lives on and is celebrated today, over 57 years later; and

WHEREAS, today, we benefit from their sacrifice, determination and perseverance by having freedom and are extremely thankful, grateful and appreciative of their example and service;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kay Ivey, Governor of Alabama, do hereby proclaim May 5, 2018, as

Freedom March Celebration Day

in the State of Alabama, as a Day of Reconciliation, Restoration and Healing in the cities of Anniston, Alabama, Oxford, Alabama and surrounding regions.
