By the Governor of Alabama

WHEREAS, scoliosis is an abnormal curvature of the spine which can lead to lifelong health issues and affects an estimated nine million people in the United States and about 110,000 people in the State of Alabama; and

WHEREAS, scoliosis affects people of all races and socio-economic groups equally; and

WHEREAS, screening programs allow for early detection and treatment which can ameliorate the long-term effects of scoliosis; and

WHEREAS, National Scoliosis Month is an opportunity to renew our commitment to increasing awareness of scoliosis and improving our understanding of this condition through research and innovation;
