WHEREAS, far too often, Americans fail to adequately show our appreciation for the service and sacrifice that was given so that we may have the freedom to live the lives we choose; and

WHEREAS, the Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity at Troy University has committed itself to supporting our veterans in an attempt to relieve the pain of these aforementioned struggles for our nation's military through "Walk Hard"; and

WHEREAS, "Walk Hard" is a 128.3-mile, six-day hike from Troy, Alabama to Panama City Beach, Florida that will be completed by 34 brothers of the Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity in the hopes of showing immense gratitude and respect for those who gave so much; and

WHEREAS, the fraternity has founded "Walk Hard" as an annual philanthropy event to raise funds and awareness for wounded veterans to benefit Jeep Sullivan's Wounded Warrior Outdoor Adventures, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, the money raised will be used to create a community for veterans struggling with the after effects of war; allowing them to support and count on one another in a way that might not be possible without Jeep Sullivan's Wounded Warrior Outdoor Adventures, Inc., and the Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity; and

WHEREAS, the brothers of Alpha Tau Omega Fraternity will embark on the journey of "Walk Hard" from Friday, March 9 through Wednesday, March 14, 2018;
